



# First Church *Chimes*

Dear Friends,

When I was appointed to First Church, the Cabinet gave me the gift of meeting with Rev. Dr. Doug Anderson for three 3-hour coaching sessions because of our unique ministry of “two sites, one church.” Doug is a United Methodist pastor whose calling is to resource and coach pastors and churches. His name may sound familiar to you because he consulted with our congregation in 2001 and made recommendations for how we might structure ourselves to best serve in ministry together in the future.

Our conversations over the past 2 years have been based on my agenda, and I found his knowledge of our history along with his experience in speaking to other congregations to be very helpful. When we met together for the last time a few weeks ago, he shared the names of several books that I look forward to reading and sharing with you. One in particular, Winning on Purpose: How to Organize Congregations to Succeed in their Mission by Bill Easum et al, I found particularly interesting in light of conversations we’ve been having here related to service commitments, our roles and planning for the future.

Here’s a brief summary of the roles we play in a healthy, vital, growing, Christian congregation:

The role of the pastors is to lead. Not boss. But to lead. Ask the right questions. Invite people into the future.

The role of the staff/team leaders is to manage. They are not the ones who do ministry but they see there are resources in place, teams in place, so that ministry can happen. The staff resources our lay leaders and lay teams. In dying or declining churches the expectation is that our staff gets the work done but in healthy churches the work of the church is done by the people of the church.

The role of the members is to do ministry. (See the paragraph above.) A healthy church is one where people are invited into a ministry that uses their spiritual gifts and resources and talents. The goal in a vital congregation is to get everyone out of the stands and onto the field of ministry. Doug shared a great illustration of the church being like a football game—except—the field is constantly expanding and the point is to get everyone out of the stands and onto the playing field.

Finally, the role of the governing board is governance. Not to control every decision or activity but to clarify our identity (who we are and what we are about... our mission), adopt priorities, provide resources for ministry to happen (budget...giving...stewardship), and set clear guidelines about what the purpose of each team might be. Doug talked about the Church Council “lining the field” so all of us know the goal, all of us know what is “in bounds” and “out of bounds,” and so we can measure our progress.

Each team, when doing its work within the overall mission of the church, when it is working within its area of responsibility, makes the decisions about how to do its work. Decisions made about ministries like Vacation Bible School or Evangelism or the Community Closet are made by the people who do those ministries --persons uninvolved in the ministry do not get “veto” power over what is to be done and how it is to be done. If people want to have a say in those decisions they need to become “doers.”

What we talked about may sound dry as dust to you but it, I believe, is crucial to our health as a congregation. If you don’t know your role then the play is going to be a disaster.

Dysfunctional, struggling congregations are places where pastors wait for someone else to lead. They are places where the staff is expected -like hired hands at a country club or bowling alley- to do the work. They are places

where a few church members work very hard and many sit back as “ministry judges” like judges at a diving competition, handing out scores and telling the lay volunteer team and staff how things could have been done better. They are churches where the governing board doesn’t make the mission clear or set clear direction about each team’s responsibilities. Confusion reigns.

It’s interesting in Joshua 6 that the Bible makes a big point of the roles each group is to play in the taking of the city of Jericho. Joshua and God develop a plan. Soldiers are to play one role. Seven priests with seven trumpets play another role. The people are to play another key role.

Do you know your role? Will you play it? If your role, as outlined in this short article, is different than the role you have been playing, are you courageous enough to learn new lines?

Do you understand the basic plot of the play? Doug pointed out that in the United Methodist Church every congregation’s mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. That’s what our play is about here at First. That’s what we’re doing. That’s what guides our efforts.

I’m thankful to share in ministry with you at this time and in this place. It’s a great day and we have many gifts and opportunities to share together and to offer to our community. I’m looking forward to the future and taking each day as it comes, as together we give our best and offer what we have.

### Church Archives



Last month I told about a quest I am following to research 10 men associated with our church who died during World War II. One of those men was Robert Smith. His story as well as that of his friend Robert Burden is currently displayed at the top of the ramp leading to the Sanctuary.

A few days ago, I was surprised and so moved to receive a letter from Judi Smith of our church thanking me for my article. It seems that her husband, Doug, is a nephew of the above mentioned Robert Smith. She writes “We know that Robert was a pilot and knew he ‘died in the war’ but your article prompted us to ask more questions. Doug’s mother [Alma] remembers that Robert was engaged to marry a woman name Mary Louise Conrad. They did not have ‘enough money’ to marry so that was the reason for Robert to sign up to ferry aircraft to Europe. He was a pilot and the family

lived, at one time, on SR 15 where the former airport was located. Robert’s parents were eventually informed about Robert’s burial in Ireland and were able to have his body shipped back to Warsaw.”

In June the following men will be featured in the same place at the top of the ramp. They are: Bernard Farris who was with General Patton’s Third Army; Robert Hunter whose ship was sunk by five Japanese bombs; Norman Leedy was killed in Germany while with the 9th Armored Division; and Edward Lucas died when his jeep was involved in a crash in California. The posters for each of these men will be displayed at The Connection Campus after they are taken down from the Downtown Campus.

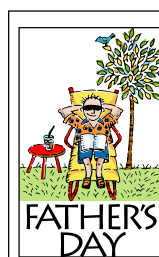

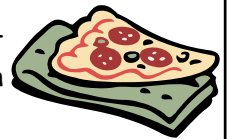

## Making the Connection



Historically, the issue of forgiveness often was not addressed in counseling sessions, because it was considered primarily a spiritual issue. While recognized as important spiritually, it was considered not necessarily relevant to the treatment process. Mental health professionals now generally recognize the critical role forgiveness can play in helping someone to move forward after being injured in some way by another person. Granting forgiveness allows us to unload the burden of someone else's behavior. Often we cling tightly to some injustice that was committed against us, because we want the other person to suffer for what he or she did. In reality we suffer, because we continue to feel hurt, outraged, victimized, etc., while the offending party goes on with his or her life.

Recently Michele and I attended a workshop at which the presenter, Michael Ceo, summed up the issue very well. He stated that "withholding forgiveness is like drinking poison and hoping the other person will die." It sounds ridiculous when phrased in these terms, but, in effect, that is what we do when we refuse to let something go. He also stated that "granting forgiveness means letting go of all hope of having a better past." We acknowledge the offense, understand how it is affecting us, and make a choice to let it go. No amount of dwelling and stewing will allow us to change history, but forgiveness can definitely shape tomorrow.

Sometimes forgiveness comes easily, and sometimes it takes a great deal of work. Forgiving does not equal forgetting, and it does not involve allowing yourself to remain vulnerable to someone who is hurtful to you. What it does involve is closing the door on a negative episode and moving on to better things.
