Dear Friends,

Probably because members of my family have Attention Deficit Disorder, I've learned to "go with the flow." I can turn on a dime, adapt to changed plans, figure it out as I go along, and keep moving forward. In my life, it's called survival.

Still, I know how important it is to have a plan and to work it, in order to accomplish the things that are important to me. Otherwise, I can spend my time spinning in circles and never get done what I'd like to. We've been moving through the series, "Enough: Discovering Joy through Simplicity and Generosity." A number of people have commented about how practical and helpful the book has been, and their desire to live more simply and free of the traps that are "out there" and that encourage us to spend, even beyond our means.

The way we begin this is to figure out where we are, make a plan and then, work it. Talk about it, think it through, write it down, identify priorities, determine intermediate goals, set a time frame. And then, don't get discouraged. Be persistent. Sometimes it takes awhile to get to the place we want to be.

We've been sharing some tools in worship that can help with managing family finances. Take advantage of them—use them! And if you need help beyond that, don't hesitate to ask someone who knows what they're doing. The assistance of a credit counselor in helping you to put everything into perspective can be invaluable.

"Tis a gift to be simple, tis a gift to be free," the Shaker Hymn says. I think that's right! It's a challenge, but arriving at that destination is well worth the work it takes along the way.

Simplicity, faithfulness, generosity...it seems to me, to be a goal worth our focus.

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY (Nov. 7)



On Sunday, Nov. 7, we will be remembering the members of Warsaw First who passed away during the past year. When Paul wrote to the church in Rome, he addressed his letter "To all God's beloved ... who are called to be saints" (Romans 1:7, NRSV). Paul regarded fellow believers as people who have responded to the good news of Christ by choosing to follow and serve God.

The New Testament emphasizes that Christians are God's beloved — special people set apart to receive his grace and to be his witnesses. All people whose minds and hearts are devoted to God are "called to be saints."

About 700 years after the church began, leaders designated November 1 as All Saints' Day to honor people whose lives reflect Christ dwelling in them. Because God has saved us, all Christians can wear the label of saint.

MAKING THE CONNECTION



Making the Connection is a new, regular feature of the Chimes contributed by the Counseling Connection, in which we will be presenting information relevant to a variety of current topics. I thought I would use this first column to present some general information about the Counseling Connection and the services we have available. The Counseling Connection has been providing counseling services since 2007, and is currently staffed by Michele Carter and Julie Nethercutt. We are both licensed by the state of Indiana to provide mental health care services. Our clients come from within First United Methodist Church as well as from the surrounding community. Many clients are self-referred, and others have been referred by their physicians, school personnel, pastors, or others in the community. We provide individual, couples, and family counseling addressing a wide range of issues, such as school adjustment, relationship stress, behavioral problems, depression, anxiety, family dynamics, history of abuse, stress related to medical issues, or loss. Our mission is to provide quality, affordable services to the community. Services are provided on a fee-for-service basis, and we do have a sliding fee scale based on income. At this time we do not participate in insurance payment plans. Appointments can be scheduled by calling our confidential telephone line at 574-269-3654 or visiting our link on the First United Methodist Church website at www.warsawfumc.org/ministries-counseling. If you have any questions or would like further information, please don't hesitate to call. Brochures are available in the Counseling Connection waiting room, just inside the main entrance of the Connection, or at the visitors desk downtown.

A Report from FUMC’s Outreach Ministry Team

UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Health Kits (long overdue report): If you recall, the Church family collected a number of items for Health Kits during this past season of Lent. During a Sunday School hour the children assembled 67 kits! These were taken to Midwest Mission Distribution Center near Springfield, IL, a Cooperating Depot in the UMCOR Relief Supply Network. The “extras” were donated to Community Closet and other relief organizations.

CROP Walk: As of October 18, ten area churches had submitted about \$5,000 collected for the 2010 Kosciusko County CROP Walk—that figure does not include online donations. “Thank you” to the five walkers who represented Warsaw FUMC and to all the financial supporters—we donated about \$450!

Fourth Quarter 2010 Coin Offering will be designated for an international ministry soon to be determined by the Outreach Ministry. Watch for that information in Sunday worship folders and next month’s *Chimes*.

Community Kitchen—Feed My Sheep and Community Closet: Both of these ministries continue to be essential to the needy in our community. A few days around Christmas & New Year’s Day (when Our Father’s House is closed) are available for a group or organization to provide and serve the meal. Contact Luke Becknell or the Church Office to volunteer. Members of FUMC’s Wednesday Morning Bible Study continue to oversee the **Community Closet**, which provides paper goods, cleaning supplies, and personal care items not covered by food stamps, for folks in need. Financial donations are accepted—Kevin Zachary shops each week spending \$250 to \$300. A “Current Needs List” is at the reception desk in the Atrium and the Welcome Center at the Connection, and collection containers are at both campuses.

Maria Sabino Humbane, our Covenant Relationship Missionary: The financial commitment for a church’s three year Covenant Relationship Missionary is \$2500 annually. As of September 30, \$1162.25 has been received for 2010. Gifts for Maria are gladly accepted anytime! (Checks should be written payable to F.U.M.C. and designated for “Maria” or “Missionary.”) Learn more about Maria’s *Ishe Anesu Project* (translated God Is With Us) within the premises of Hilltop United Methodist Church in Skubva, Mutare, Zimbabwe, and see some photos at her website, www.isheanesu.com.

Any contributions can be taken to the Church Office. “STREAK-LESS” microfiber cleaning cloths, a “must-have” for Fall cleaning projects, are available to purchase--\$4 each or 3 for \$10. Proceeds are designated for UMCOR’s flood relief fund for Northern Indiana, a continuing need from the 2008 floods. The cloths are available in the Church Office during the week or on Sunday mornings by contacting Kathee Reed, Ann Gephart, Priscilla Waidley, or Jan Wilcox.

Music as ministry of healing

Nearly every one of us can recall a song that made us stop for a minute and listen with a smile.

United Methodist Student Day scholarship recipient Maria Payne considers it her calling to create those moments for the people who need them the most.

Growing up in a family of five in Aberdeen, Md., Maria was active in Grace United Methodist Church. Behind the walls of Grace, her interest in music began as she played guitar and piano for her church.

"I might have never gotten involved in music without my church," she commented.

That early interest in music followed Maria to college. She did not want to play solely for entertainment. Maria sought to use her music to serve others. Then she learned about Shenandoah University in Winchester, Va. A United

Methodist-affiliated school, Shenandoah offers a music therapy program.

"Music therapy," Maria noted, "is using music to inspire a positive response from persons with a particular need. Most therapists specialize in helping the elderly, the sick, and the physically or developmentally handicapped. Music can lower stress, raise spirits or encourage action."

When Maria was applying to college, her mother knew what to do, having sent two children to college. She told her daughter to apply for a scholarship through the United Methodist General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Sure enough, Maria received support from The United Methodist Church to help her pay for college, something for which she is grateful. "College is really expensive. It's wonderful that the church supports good kids who want to do well in life," said Maria.

When we United Methodists support United Methodist Student day, we open the door for persons like Maria and minister to the people she will touch.

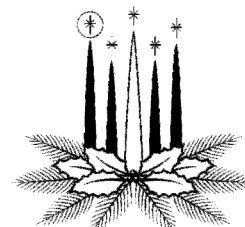
